FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The joy arising from the celebration of Christmas finds its completion today in the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord as we reach the end of the Christmastide giving place to the season of Ordinary Time.

Originally the baptism of Christ was celebrated on Epiphany, which commemorates the coming of the Magi, the baptism of Christ, and the wedding at Cana. Over time in the West, however, the celebration of the baptism of the Lord came to be commemorated as a distinct feast from the Epiphany and it is celebrated on the first Sunday following that feast.

In fact, the Tridentine Calendar has no feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It was almost four centuries later that the feast was instituted as a different feast under the denomination "Commemoration of the Baptism of our Lord." In his revision of the calendar five years later, Blessed Pope John XXIII kept on 13 January the celebration of this feast. A mere 14 years after the institution of the feast, Pope Paul VI set its date as the first Sunday after 6 January or, if in a particular country the Epiphany is celebrated on 7 or 8 January, on the following Monday. Blessed Pope John Paul II initiated a tradition whereby on this feast the Pope baptizes babies in the Sistine Chapel.

Continuing our liturgical reflections from the Fathers of the Church, I offer the following paragraphs from a sermon of St. Maximus of Turin (+ 423). His teachings are particularly important since he was at the synod of Milan where the bishops of Northern Italy accepted the celebrated letter (*epistola dogmatica*) of Leo I, setting forth the orthodox doctrine of the Incarnation against the Nestorians and Eutychians. He is the author of numerous discourses and all of them manifest his solicitude for the eternal welfare of his flock, and in many he fearlessly rebukes the survivals of paganism and defends the orthodox faith against the inroads of heresy. Here he clearly elaborates on two aspects of the mystery of the Baptism of the Lord:

1) - The celebration of our Lord's Baptism constitutes a new epiphany, or theophany, of the mystery of the Incarnate Word: "Reason demands that this feast of the Lord's baptism, which I think could be called the feast of his birthday, should follow soon after the Lord's birthday, during the same season, even though many years intervened between the two events. At Christmas He was born a man; today He is reborn sacramentally. Then He was born from the Virgin; today He is born in mystery. When He was born a man, his mother Mary held him close to her heart; when He is born in mystery, God the Father embraces him with his voice when He says: *This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased: listen to him*. The mother caresses the tender baby on her lap; the Father serves his Son by his loving testimony. The mother holds the child for the Magi to adore; the Father reveals that his Son is to be worshiped by all the nations. That is why the Lord Jesus went to the river for baptism; that is why he wanted his holy body to be washed with Jordan's water."

2) - The reason why Jesus –being innocent– wished to receive John's Baptism: "Why would a holy man desire baptism? Listen to the answer: Christ is baptized, not to be made holy by the water, but to make the water holy, and by his cleansing, to purify the waters which he touched. For the consecration of Christ involves a more significant consecration of the water. For when the Savior is washed, all water for our baptism is made clean, purified at its source for the dispensing of baptismal grace to the people of future ages. Christ is the first to be baptized then, so that Christians will follow after him with confidence."

As we contemplate this deep and beautiful mystery of the baptism of Our Lord, let us also remember the mystery of our own baptism and the promises we made by ourselves or through our parents and godparents.

A person can come into a country with fraudulent documents and then be trafficked.

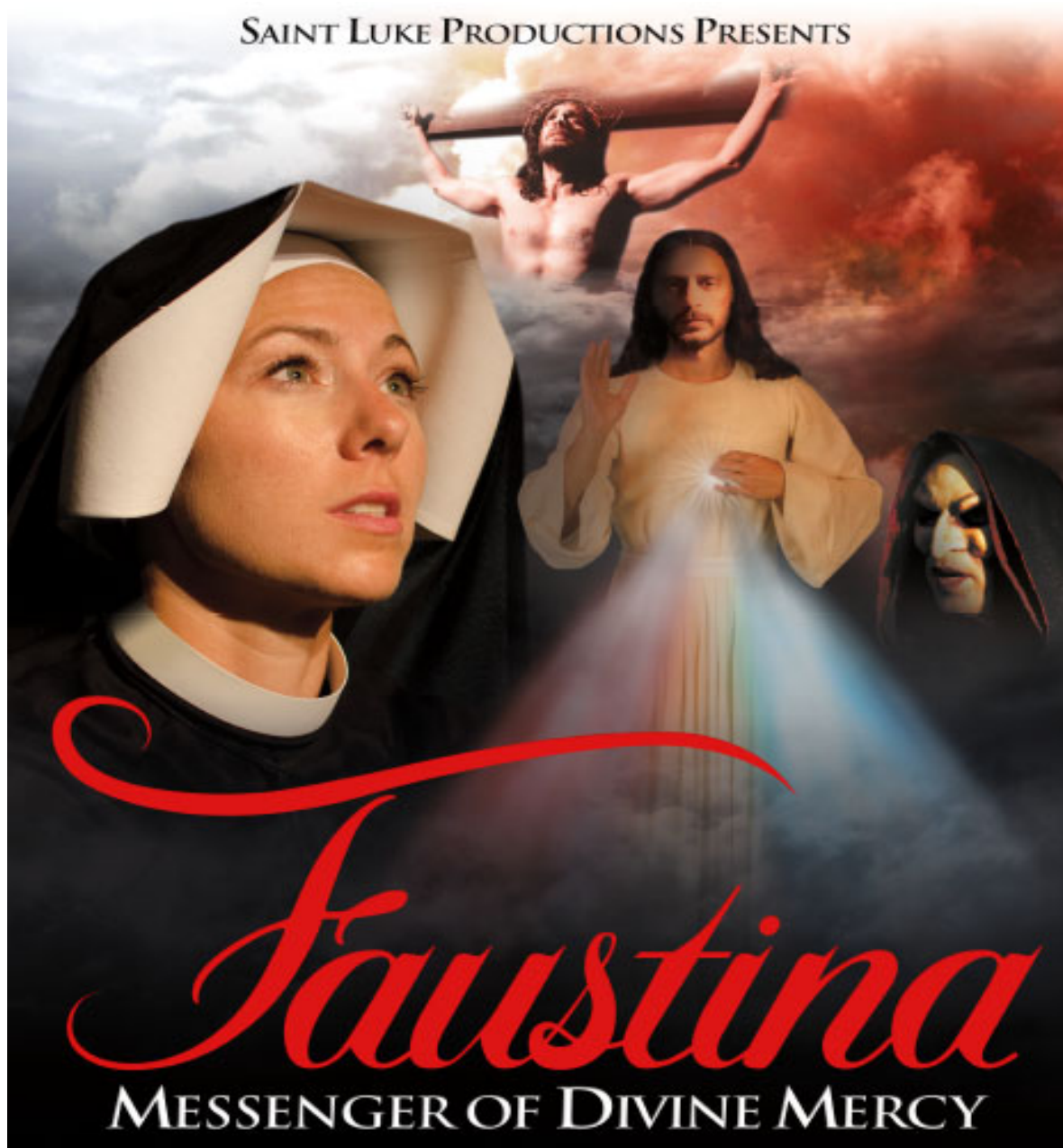
A person can be smuggled into a country and then be trafficked.

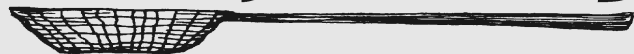

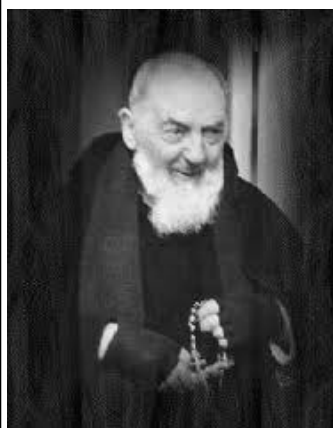

INTERNATIONAL PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE of Our Lady of Fatima

The world-famous International Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima was sculpted in 1947 by Jose Thedim, based on the description of Sr. Lucia, one of the three young seers who saw Our Lady each month from May to October 1917 in Fatima, Portugal. On October 13, 1947, in the presence of some 150,000 pilgrims, the statue was blessed by the Bishop of Leiria at Fatima, Portugal to be the pilgrim, the traveler.

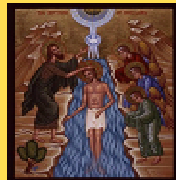

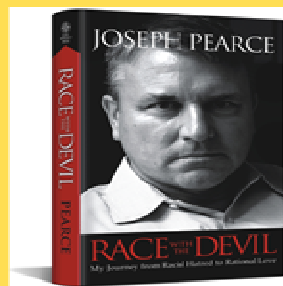

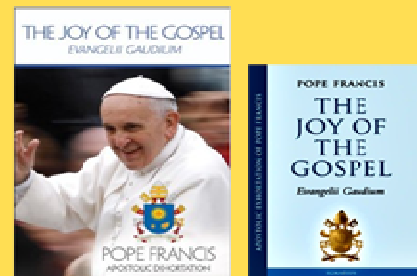
