








FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

St Thérèse of Lisieux, known as the Little Flower (1873-1897), was a Carmelite nun whose fame of sainthood spread rapidly after her death. Her autobiography, *The Story of a Soul*, (translated into over 60 languages) has been read by thousands of people who have remained astonished at the way of holiness that she presents.

St. Thérèse strongly recommends a way of spiritual infancy, a way full of confidence and love. She makes humility its foundation, for there can be none other. Her practice and teaching can be summed up as follows: Love God and offer Him many little sacrifices; abandon yourself to His arms like a little child, and, in order to do that, obey like a little child and be humble as a little child. She therefore made herself the servant of her sisters, tried to render obedience to all without exception, and had no fear but the fear of following her own will. She knew well how to keep herself from being lifted up by pride, and how to remain always little through humility, so little that she was content that nobody should think of her, that all should trample her under their feet, that the Divine Infant should treat her as a toy of no value. What death-to-self! What humility above all, did she not require to bring her to such a degree of perfection! It is not surprising, then, that God has glorified a soul so generous and humble and has made her the great wonder-worker of our times.

She says: "I have no need to grow bigger; on the contrary, I must remain little and become so more and more." And she clarifies what she means by remaining little: "It is to recognize our nothingness, to expect everything from God as a little child expects everything from its father; it is to be disquieted about nothing, and not to be set on making our living. Even among the poor, they give the child what is necessary, but as soon as he grows up, his father no longer wants to feed him and says: 'Work now, you can take care of yourself. It was so as not to hear this that I never wanted to grow up, feeling that I was incapable of making my living, eternal life in heaven.'

To be little is not attributing to oneself the virtues that one practices, believing oneself incapable of anything, but recognizing that God places this treasure in the hands of His little child to be used when necessary; but it remains always God's treasure. Finally, it is not to become discouraged over one's faults, for children fall often, but they are too little to hurt themselves very much."

Remaining little means renouncing growth in the eyes of others and in one's eyes. It means expecting nothing from our own nothingness; it means being immersed in the ocean of the divinity, with no possibility of seeing the least progress; it means living in the purest of faith. It is total poverty, complete abandonment to God who loves us.

St. Thérèse's *Little Way* is a whole new way of life, a way of holiness that is open to all because it requires nothing from anyone but the ordinary day-to-day actions. The Little Way finds joy in the present moment, in being pleasing to God, in total surrender to the One who loves us. It is an invitation to all to love the God of the present moment, the only God who asks nothing from us but that we believe in His love.

May she grant us the grace to live her Little Way of holiness!



AN URGENT MESSAGE FROM CARDINAL GEORGE

"Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in silence marked by contemplation prepares us to celebrate the Eucharist well and with greater affectivity. Genuflecting before the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved deepens our faith in Christ's real presence among his people. When religious rituals disappear, life becomes barren and caught up in activities that seal the soul against God's presence and still the heart to the cry of the poor."

Our current economic problems and political impasses bear devastating witness to a society obsessed with controlling every aspect of experience and life. This drive is deadly and destroys trust, which is betrayed in order to advance one's own projects. Belief in Christ's presence and in God's providence, by contrast, frees people to trust that they can take care of those whom God has given them to love without fear of losing their deepest selves. Devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and to the Sacred Heart of Jesus places us within the safety of God's infinite love and gives us courage to risk our own lives for the salvation of others. Faith makes us free.

As everyone knows, freedom to express our faith through the public ministries of the church is now outlawed. Contesting the current HHS mandate in which the government usurps the right to determine which of our ministries are truly "religious" and which are not is a series of lawsuits being brought by dioceses and universities and other Catholic organizations. That it is necessary is clear in a declaration from Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius, quoted in many of the plaintiffs' legal briefs, that "We are at war." So far as I know, this is the first time that a U.S. government official has declared war on citizens of the United States who do not agree with government policy. The public conversation continues to be manipulated by the government and many in the media, hiding what is at stake in the mandate to strip religious institutions of their identity so that they can be forced to act against their religious beliefs."

Parish Registration/Registration Updates

In order for priests and staff to know who is part of Our Lady of Peace's family, you need to register.

... If you are over 21 and are still registered on your parent's registration, you need to register on your own.

... If it has been more than 3 years since you've last updated your registration, please fill out a registration card again.

... If you have not filled out an official registration card in the past 5 years, you are not registered at Our Lady of Peace Church (even if you have been at the parish for 10+ years). This is due to database changes made 5 years ago or because you have never filled out a card.

You can register at Our Lady of Peace even if we are not the closest parish to your home, however, you can only be officially registered at one parish in the Diocese of San Jose.

Benefits of registration include having a historical record of your being part of the parish, inclusion of annual parish mailings and wallet calendar, advance registration for religious education classes, special considerations as appropriate for scheduling sacraments, and more.

Your cooperation with this will help our staff minister to you more effectively. Please see future bulletins for the registration card or stop by the Rectory.




