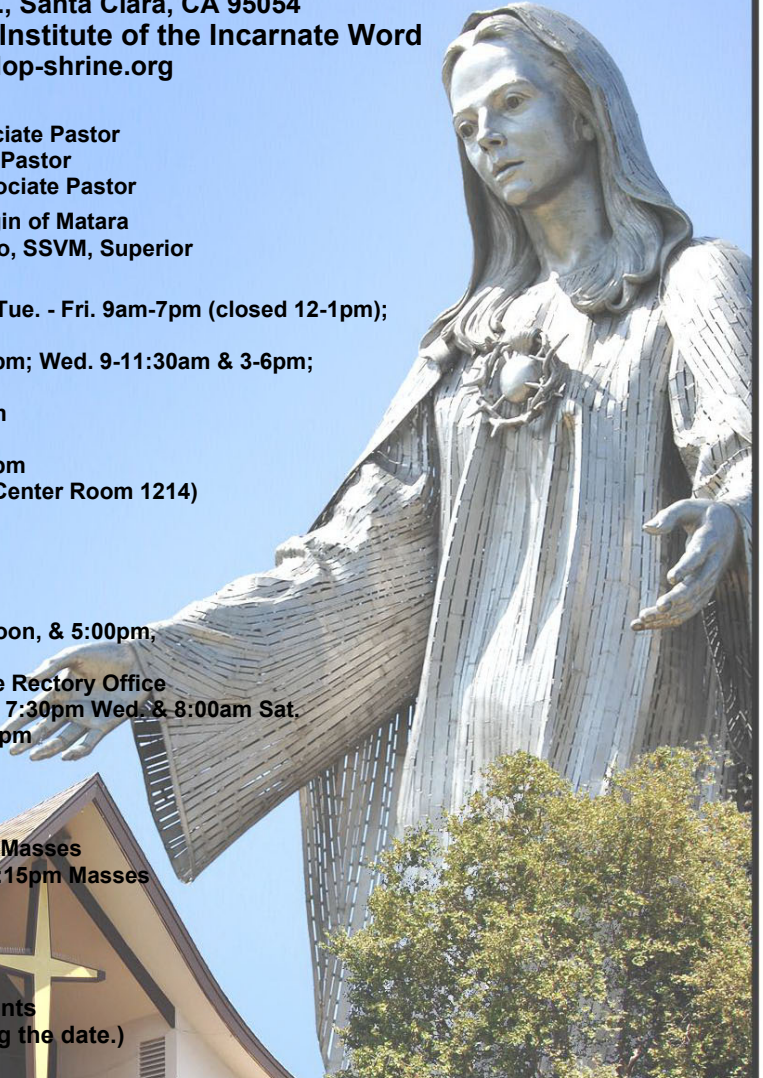

## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

During the month of September the Church celebrates two feasts in which we are reminded of the sorrowful mysteries of our Lord during the Passiontide. One is, September 14<sup>th</sup>, the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, a very special day for our Sisters, the Servants of the Lord and the Virgin of Matará, since this is their main feast day. The other is, September 15<sup>th</sup> when the Church remembers our sorrowful Mother at the foot of the Cross.

On the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross (or Triumph of the Cross) next Saturday, we will honor the Holy Cross by which Christ redeemed the world. The public veneration of the Cross of Christ originated in the fourth century, according to early accounts, beginning with the miraculous discovery of the Cross on September 14, 326, by Saint Helen, mother of Constantine, while she was on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem –the same day that two churches built at the site of Calvary by Constantine were dedicated. The observance of the Feast of the Exaltation (probably from a Greek word meaning, “bringing to light”) of the Cross has been celebrated by Christians on September 14 ever since.

This day is one of those special occasions when we recall the great love shown to us by Jesus, when He chose to die on the Cross to save us. Christians “exalt” the Cross of Christ as the instrument and the cause of our salvation. Adoration of the Cross is, thus, adoration of Jesus Christ, the God Man, who suffered and died on this Roman instrument of torture for our redemption from sin and death.

In fact, the cross is the cause of our hope and joy and this is why on this day and ever we acclaim: *O Crux, ave spes unica!* Hail, O Cross, our only hope!

On the Cross human misery meets divine mercy. The adoration of this unlimited mercy is for man the only way to open himself to the mystery which the Cross reveals.

The Cross is planted in the earth and would seem to extend its roots in human malice, but it reaches up, pointing as it were to the heavens, pointing to the goodness of God. By means of the Cross of Christ, the Evil One has been defeated, death is overcome, life is given to us, hope is restored, and light is imparted.

*O Crux, ave spes unica!* As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life (Jn 3:14-15), says Jesus. What do we see then when we bring our eyes to the cross where Jesus was nailed (cf. Jn 19:37)? We contemplate the sign of God’s infinite love for humanity.

Yes, *God so loved the world that he gave his only Son* (Jn 3:16). We admire –overwhelmed and gratified– the breadth and length and height and depth of the love of Christ which surpasses all knowledge (cf. Eph 3:18-19)!

*O Crux, ave spes unica!* In the Garden of Eden, at the foot of the tree, there was a woman, Eve (cf. Gen 3). Seduced by the Evil One, she takes possession of what she thinks is divine life. Instead it is a seed of death which enters into her (cf. Jas 1:15; Rom 6:23). On Calvary, at the foot of the tree of the cross, there was another woman, Mary (cf. Jn 19:25-27). Accepting God’s plan, She shares intimately in the Son’s gift of self to the Father for the life of the world and, receiving from Jesus the entrustment of John the Apostle, She becomes the Mother of all mankind.

It is the Virgin most Sorrowful, whom we will remember on September the 15<sup>th</sup> in the liturgy and whom we entrust the present and the future of our lives and of our community.

The Cross is the “privileged place” where the love of God is revealed and shown to us. Through the mystery of your Cross and your resurrection, save us O Lord! Amen.

### What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul and divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind: "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt 28:20).

There are 168 hours in a week: it takes about 336 people to keep adoration going 24/7, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of 411 people.

While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this. Don't be afraid to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.

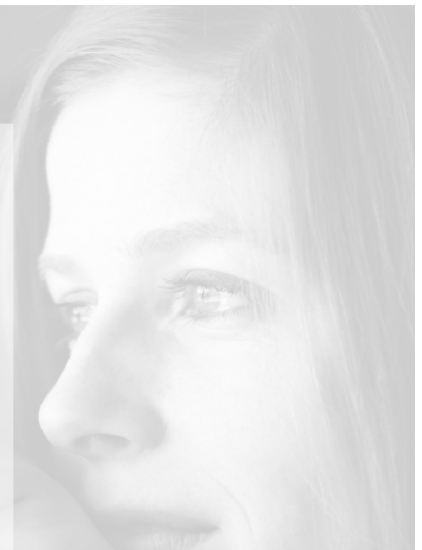

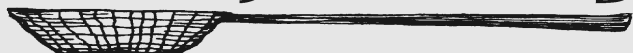

## Sacrosanctum Concilium

Pope Paul VI  
December 4, 1963

112. The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art. The main reason for this pre-eminence is that, as sacred song united to the words, it forms a necessary or integral part of the solemn liturgy.

Holy Scripture, indeed, has bestowed praise upon sacred song [42], and the same may be said of the fathers of the Church and of the Roman pontiffs who in recent times, led by St. Pius X, have explained more precisely the ministerial function supplied by sacred music in the service of the Lord.

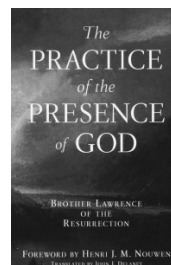
Therefore sacred music is to be considered the more holy in proportion as it is more closely connected with the liturgical action, whether it adds delight to prayer, fosters unity of minds, or confers greater solemnity upon the sacred rites. But the Church approves of all forms of true art having the needed qualities, and admits them into divine worship.

Accordingly, the sacred Council, keeping to the norms and precepts of ecclesiastical tradition and discipline, and having regard to the purpose of sacred music, which is the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful, decrees as follows.
