FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today, October the 13th, is a new anniversary of the last apparition to Our Lady in Fatima. Let us remember that day, with the words of Sr. Lucia: "There was a multitude of people (70,000) under the torrential rain. The scene was similar to the previous apparitions. Neither the mud nor the rain stopped the people from kneeling and humbly pleading and supplicating. Upon arriving at Cova de Iria, next to the tree, I asked the people to close their umbrellas and to pray the rosary. Soon after we saw a reflection of light, and immediately Our Lady was on the oak tree. I asked her, 'What is it that you want?' She replied, 'I want to tell you to build a chapel here in my honor. I am Our Lady of the Rosary. Continue to pray the rosary every day. The war is ending and the soldiers will return home soon.' I asked, 'Will the sick be healed?' 'Some yes, others no; it is necessary for them to amend their lives, to ask forgiveness for their sins,' she replied. With a sorrowful look, Our Lady said: 'May our God be offended no longer. He is already offended too much.' Her hands opened, and off of them reflected the light of the sun. As she rose into the sky, her own brilliance continued to be seen in the midst of the sun's light. I cried out for all to look up towards the sun. The miracle of the sun was happening, as promised three months ago, as proof of the authenticity of the Fatima apparitions. The rain ceased and the sun rotated three times, launching variously colored rays of light all around. It seemed as if the sun was coming down from the sky toward the people. After 10 minutes of the miracle, the sun returned to its normal state."

The miracle of the sun was seen for thousands of people and their testimonies have been gathered by different scholars. I would like to bring to our consideration one of those testimonies, the one by Dr. José Maria de Almeida Garrett, an eyewitness of the Miracle. Dr. Almeida Garrett was professor at the Faculty of Sciences of Coimbra, Portugal and these are his words: "It must have been 1:30 pm when there arose, at the exact spot where the children were, a column of smoke, thin, fine and bluish, which extended up to perhaps two meters above their heads, and evaporated at that height. This phenomenon, perfectly visible to the naked eye, lasted for a few seconds. [...] The sky, which had been overcast all day, suddenly cleared; the rain stopped and it looked as if the sun were about to fill with light the countryside that the wintery morning had made so gloomy. I was looking at the spot of the apparitions in a serene, if cold, expectation of something happening and with diminishing curiosity because a long time had passed without anything to excite my attention. The sun, a few moments before, had broken through the thick layer of clouds which hid it and now shone clearly and intensely. Suddenly I heard the uproar of thousands of voices, and I saw the whole multitude spread out in that vast space at my feet... turn their backs to that spot where, until then, all their expectations had been focused, and look at the sun on the other side. I turned around, too, toward the point commanding their gaze and I could see the sun, like a very clear disc, with its sharp edge, which gleamed without hurting the sight. It could not be confused with the sun seen through a fog (there was no fog at that moment), for it was neither veiled nor dim. At Fatima, it kept its light and heat, and stood out clearly in the sky, with a sharp edge, like a large gaming table. [...] During this time, the sun's disc did not remain immobile; it had a giddy motion, [but] not like the twinkling of a star in all its brilliance for it spun round upon itself in a mad whirl. During the solar phenomenon, which I have just described, there were also changes of color in the atmosphere. Looking at the sun, I noticed that everything was becoming darkened. I looked first at the nearest objects and then extended my glance further afield as far as the horizon. I saw everything had assumed an amethyst color. [...] Then, suddenly, one heard a clamor, a cry of anguish breaking from all the people. The sun, whirling wildly, seemed all at once to loosen itself from the firmament and, blood red, advance threateningly upon the earth as if to crush us with its huge and fiery weight. The sensation during those moments was truly terrible. All the phenomena which I have described were observed by me in a calm and serene state of mind without any emotional disturbance. It is for others to interpret and explain them. Finally, I must declare that never, before or after October 13 [1917], have I observed similar atmospheric or solar phenomena."

As we remember that wonderful day and as we renew our consecration and devotion to our Blessed Mother I would like to invite all of you to join us in our last Fatima Procession of 2013 at Our Lady of Peace, today at 9:00 pm (after the 8:00 pm Mass) where we are going to join Pope Francis in the consecration to the World to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. And let us always say together as Bl. John Paul II taught us: *Totus Tuus ego sum Maria.*

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul and divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind: "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt 28:20).

There are 168 hours in a week: it takes about 336 people to keep adoration going 24/7, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of 411 people.

While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this. Don't be afraid to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.

The parish applied for and received a grant from Silicon Valley Power for a solar power system of 27kw that will provide some of the electrical needs of our church campus.

The grant covers the cost, installation, and maintenance of the system, and is valued at \$100,000.
