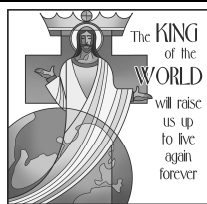

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As I mentioned to you last week, the month of November is traditionally dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory which helps us to meditate on the final destination of our earthly pilgrimage. From the very beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. Holy Scripture and the Fathers command prayers, almsgiving, penance and oblations for the departed, and the Council of Trent (Sess. XXV, "*De Purgatorio*") in virtue of this tradition not only asserts the existence of Purgatory, but adds "that the souls therein detained are aided by the suffrages of the faithful and principally by the acceptable sacrifice of the altar."

Praying for the dead is a noble practice that implies belief in the resurrection of the dead, in accordance with what has been revealed to us by Sacred Scripture and, in a complete way, by the Gospel. Moreover, that those on earth are still in communion with the souls in Purgatory is the earliest Christian teaching, and that the living aid the dead by their prayers and works of satisfaction is clear from the tradition of the Church. St. Augustine affirms that the "the Holy Sacrifice of the altar aid the faithful departed and move the Lord to deal with them in mercy and kindness." Blessed John Paul II said that "joined to the merits of the saints, our fraternal prayer comes to the aid of those who await the beatific vision. Intercession for the dead, just as the life of those living according to the divine commandments, obtains the merits that serve the full attainment of salvation." Therefore, praying for the dead conveys an expression of the fraternal charity of the one family of God, by which "we are faithful to the Church's deepest vocation" (Lumen gentium, n. 51): "to save souls who will love God eternally" (Thérèse of Lisieux, Prayers, 6; cf. Manuscript A 77r°).

This doctrine is totally related to the doctrine of the existence of Purgatory that we talked about last week. It is a very consoling truth that enables hearts left behind to break the barriers of time and death to convert unspoken words into prayers, unburned incense into sacrifice, unoffered flowers into alms, and undone acts of kindness into help for eternal life. "Take away Purgatory," says Archbishop Fulton Sheen "and the grief for our unkindness would be bitter and our sorrow for our forgetfulness would be piercing. Without Purgatory our bowed heads and moments of silence would be empty. With Purgatory the bowed head gives way to a bent knee, the moment of silence turns to a moment of prayer, and a fading wreath to the abiding offering of sacrifice in the Mass of that great Hero, Christ. Purgatory enables us to atone for our ingratitude because our prayers, mortifications, and sacrifices make it possible to bring joy and consolation to the ones we love. Love is stronger than death; hence, there should be love for those who have gone before us. Shall death cut off gratitude? Certainly not!"

The Church assures us that not being able to give more to them in this world, we can still seek them in the hands of divine justice and give them the assurance of our love and the purchasing price of our redemption. It is the traditional faith of Catholics that the souls in Purgatory are not separated from the Church, and that the love which is the bond of union between the Church's members should embrace those who have departed this life in God's grace.

Then, let us heed, our Lord's request to St. Faustina Kowalska: "Today bring to Me the souls who are in the prison of Purgatory, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy. Let the torrents of My Blood cool down their scorching flames. All these souls are greatly loved by Me. They are making retribution to My justice. *It is in your power to bring them relief.* Draw all the indulgences from the treasury of My Church and offer them on their behalf. Oh, if you only knew the torments they suffer, you would continually offer for them the alms of the spirit and pay off their debt to My justice." (Diary, 1226)

Brothers and Sisters, let us embrace this practice since our prayers and sacrifices can help those who are still waiting in Purgatory. The saints have not hesitated to warn us that we have a real duty toward those who are still in purgatorial expiation. Let us always listen to them, let us always listen to the teachings of our Mother, the Catholic Church.

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul and divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind: "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt 28:20).

There are 168 hours in a week: it takes about 336 people to keep adoration going 24/7, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of 411 people.

While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this. Don't be afraid to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.

Father Kenneth Nobrega, Director of Vocations, Diocese of Oakland

Father Nobrega has spoken on the topics of exorcism, the reality of evil, spiritual warfare, and how the Church helps those who struggle with evil, in parishes and at conferences around the State of California. He was born and reared in Oakland and attended Catholic elementary school there, and later attended Cal State Hayward. Prior to entering the priesthood, Father Nobrega was a building contractor and operated a licensed care facility for mentally disabled men.

Fr. Hendrickson is a priest of the Diocese of San Jose. Hailing from Morgan Hill, he was ordained to the priesthood in 2001. He served as a naval chaplain, both active duty and as a drilling reservist, from 2003-2012.

Fr. Samuel is the Parochial Vicar at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church in the Diocese of San Jose. He became an Incarnate Word (IVE) priest at age 70 in 2004 and also directs an inner healing ministry. He was married for 42 years before his wife passed away in 1998. He and his wife have 10 children, 20 grandchildren, and 10 great grandchildren.

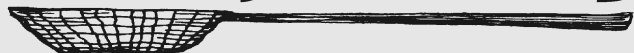

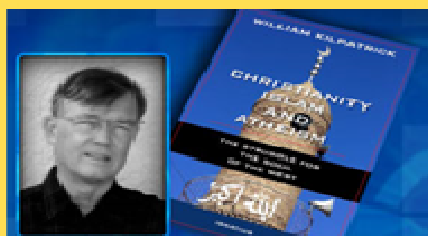

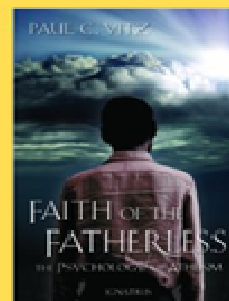

Victims of Human Trafficking can be found in numerous occupation, including sweatshops, forced prostitution, domestic servitude, restaurants, agriculture, construction, and hotel/motel cleaning services.

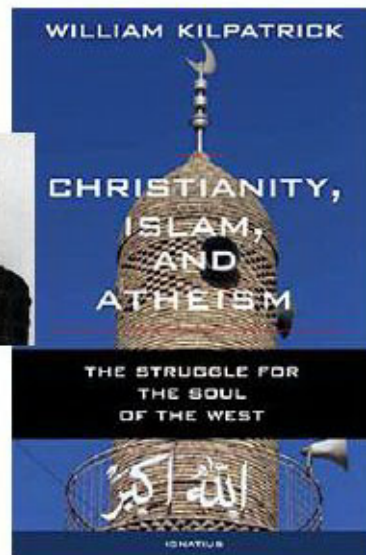
