

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today the Liturgy of the Church reaches the last Sunday in Ordinary Time. We are, in fact, at the end of another liturgical year in the history of salvation. As it always happens on this occasion, in the three cycles of readings of the Liturgy, the Church presents the Gospel of the Last Judgment, this year taken from the 21st chapter of St. Luke's Gospel. During this particular time of the year we are invited to reflect upon our Lord's second coming. And in just one more week we will celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King after which we will begin a new liturgical year with the Advent season.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that the resurrection of all the dead, *of both the just and the unjust*, will precede the Last Judgment. This will be *the hour when all who are in the tombs will hear [the Son of man's] voice and come forth, those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment.* (Mt 25: 31,32,46). Then Christ will come *in his glory, and all the angels with him.... Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will place the sheep at his right hand, but the goats at the left.... And they will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.*

In the presence of Christ, who is Truth itself, the truth of each man's relationship with God will be laid bare. The Last Judgment will reveal even to its furthest consequences the good each person has done or failed to do during his earthly life. In other words, the Lord has fixed a day, called in the Scriptures *the day of the Lord*, on which the Eternal Judge will make known his power and majesty. *The Lord*, says the Psalmist, *shall be known when he executes judgment.* (Ps 9:17.) St. Bernard commenting this text writes: "The Lord, who is now unknown while he seeks mercy, shall be known when he executes justice." (*Lib. de 12 Rad.*)

The Last Judgment will come when Christ returns in glory. Only the Father knows the day and the hour; only He determines the moment of its coming. Then, through his Son Jesus Christ He will pronounce the final word on all history. We shall know the ultimate meaning of the whole work of creation and of the entire economy of salvation and understand the marvelous ways by which his Providence led everything towards its final end.

The Last Judgment will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that God's love is stronger than death. Pope Benedict XVI in his beautiful Encyclical *Spes Salvi* affirms: "The image of the Last Judgment is not primarily an image of terror, but an image of hope; for us it may even be the decisive image of hope. Is it not also a frightening image? I would say: it is an image that evokes responsibility, an image, therefore, of that fear of which Saint Hilary spoke when he said that all *our fear has its place in love.* God is justice and creates justice. This is our consolation and our hope. And in his justice there is also grace." (cf. 44)

"A judgment," says St. Chrysostom, "terrible to sinners, but desirable and sweet to the just." (*Hom. 3 de Dav.*) The last judgment shall fill sinners with terror, but will be a source of joy and sweetness to the elect; for God will then give praise to each one according to his works. (1Cor 4:5). The Apostle tells us that on that day the just will be raised above the clouds to be united to the angels, and to increase the number of those who pay homage to the Lord, *We shall be taken up together with them in the clouds to meet Christ, into the air* (1 Th 4:16.)

Dear brothers and sisters, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches "the Last Judgment calls men to conversion while God is still giving them 'the acceptable time... the day of salvation.'" (CCC,1041). Therefore, I pray that our contemplation on the Last Judgment might inspire in us—as it was in the early Church—a holy fear of God in such a way that it may influence our daily living and serve as a criterion by which to order our present life, as a summon to our conscience, and at the same time as hope in God's justice.

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul and divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind: "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt 28:20).

There are 168 hours in a week: it takes about 336 people to keep adoration going 24/7, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of 411 people.

While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this. Don't be afraid to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.

Dear Parishioners,

In particular, participation in the sacrament of Reconciliation and in the banquet of the one Body of Christ offers to the Christian family the grace and the responsibility of overcoming every division and of moving towards the fullness of communion willed by God, responding in this way to the ardent desire of the Lord: "that they may be one."(62)

Victims of Human Trafficking can be found in numerous occupation, including sweatshops, forced prostitution, domestic servitude, restaurants, agriculture, construction, and hotel/motel cleaning services.

We will look at some of the forms of Human Trafficking within our own country and around the globe.
